PORTER =


5449 - cab bâl - from 5445; a porter  
(to bear, bearer of) burden(s)

5445 - câbal - a primitive root - to carry  
(lit. or fig) be burdensome; spec. to be  
gravid - bear, be a burden, carry,  
strong to labor.

BURDENS =

4853 - massa - from 5375; a burden;  
spec. tribute

5375 - nâcâh - a primitive root - to lift ....  
forgive .... hold up .... lay .... lift up ....  
marry, magnify, pardon, raise up,  
take away, yield.

Matthew 11:30




The Kabbalah, The Most Sacred Knowledge of Mystical Wisdom, is the PATH WAY of Redemption by Re-Membering Home.
